Model Railroad & Circus Display Barn Information

Brief History of the organization that runs the show

South East Wisconsin Antique Power and Collectibles Society (SEWAPCS) was organized on Wednesday, September 27, 1991, to preserve our agricultural past. Our first meeting was held on November 6, 1991, in the Union Grove Middle School Commons. Persons interested in old tractors, gas/"hit–n–miss" engines, farm machinery, garden machinery/implements, toys, crafts, or anything from the rural days gone by were (and still are) invited to attend. Fourteen interested people were present at the inaugural meeting.

On December 4, 1991, the newly formed society met again and many new faces were present. Our first "Fall Harvest Days" show date was set for September 19 and 20, 1992, and was to be held at the Racine County Fairgrounds, Union Grove, Wisconsin

Model Trains at the Show

There has been several model train Displays at the show for over the past decade. The Displays started off with different Garden Railroad displays by different Garden clubs from the Southeastern Wisconsin area, to several different 3-rail O-Scale (Lionel) groups bringing layouts. The Model Train Displays have always been a hit with the kids of all ages. At the 2012 Fall harvest days show it was mentioned we should fill a barn with model railroad displays as the barn the layouts were in was only one third full, well we are going to fill it (maybe a second barn also)

Fall harvest Days is a three day show Friday-Saturday-Sunday (with Thursday to set up displays) Buildings are locked up at the end of each day, and a volunteer group of members provide security at the Fairgrounds on Thursday, Friday and Saturday Evening, however the SEWAPCS is not responsible for any items left overnight.

The SEWAPCS has set aside the use of three buildings for train Displays (red squares on map), we will fill them in the following order, Open Class,4-H / FFA/Youth, and last the Goat building. As a reminder this show is in September and these are unheated buildings, so dress for the weather.

Model Circus at the Show

2013 will mark the first year we will have space available to have Circus displays at the show, we will have the Circus displays in the same area of the show as the Model Railroad displays. Please let your friends know

Model Trains & Circus Layout information & Display information at the Show

Model Railroad Group members working their group displays will receive free admission for the three day show, and as always the parking is free. Each member is to fill out the form included with this package and will need to submit it to the people at the registration desk at the show to receive their show pass. We ask that you keep the Displays up for all three days and you may start to take down the displays after the completion of the Tractor Parade on Sunday Afternoon (about 4PM).

Displays must submit the area they need to the Train Barn Show group by June 30th so they can arrange the space in the Barn.

Also let us know the number of table and chairs needed by you group so we can have them for you

Model Trains Dealer Information at the Show

Model Train Dealers are always welcome to sell at Fall Harvest Days, we know usually the space required form a model train dealer is different than the Flea market people, we will rent two different sized areas, a small booth (approx. a 5x 10 foot area), and a large booth a 10 x 10 area. Each booth size will come with one table one chair; you may bring additional tables and chairs to fill your booth as needed.

We ask that dealers try to be there for Saturday & Sunday,

Space fees are for all three days for either table or booth (see attached sheet for rates)

Show Hours and Building Information

The show hours are Friday, Saturday, & Sunday 9AM to 5PM

Setup is available on Thursday from 8AM to 6PM, Building access by 8AM for the three days of the show.

On Friday after the show shuts down will be a Tractor/Truck pull at the Grandstand. This event is \$5.00 and is a lot of fun. Food will be sold at this event by a local Church

Also please note that these buildings are unheated, buildings are locked up every night and the grounds are patrolled. All buildings have power inside of them, any dealer needing power please let us know and we will have a power drop available for you.

Things to remember that are at the Show

Two buildings will be available for the Trains & Circus each building is about 50x100 feet

Parking and getting into the Show

Please refer to the attached map. Dealers and Exhibiters will be able to enter and leave at Gate 7, (this gate will be closed to general public for the show they will enter at Gate 5.) You may drive into the show and keep you vehicle parked with in the show grounds, however we ask that if you need to leave during the show the vehicle is parked in the general parking area.

If you do park on the grounds please drive towards the train buildings using West Drive (along the West edge of the fairgrounds) and park near the far food buildings along Rowe Drive and West Drive.
